




## Gus

#### Instructions (for instructors)


- 1. Begin by looking at the images on pages 3-7 with the learners. Elicit from them what they see and help with oral language where necessary.
- 2. Bring the learner's attention to the key vocabulary words on pages 9-13. Elicit meaning/oral vocabulary relevant to each image and then focus on the initial letters/phonics/spelling of the written words underneath the images. Spend time on the target short vowel as needed.
- 3. Either together as a class or individually, have the learners complete the vocabulary check section on pages 14-17 by circling the word that matches the image for each page.
- 4. Together as a class, read the sentences on page 22. Have learners cut out each sentence and match each sentence to one of the pages from 3-7. After matching, having learners glue in the box underneath the image.
- 5. After several readings of the story as a class, in pairs and individually, assist the learners in completing the comprehension section by circling the correct answer.









