Donna was stressed because she didn't want to be late for work.





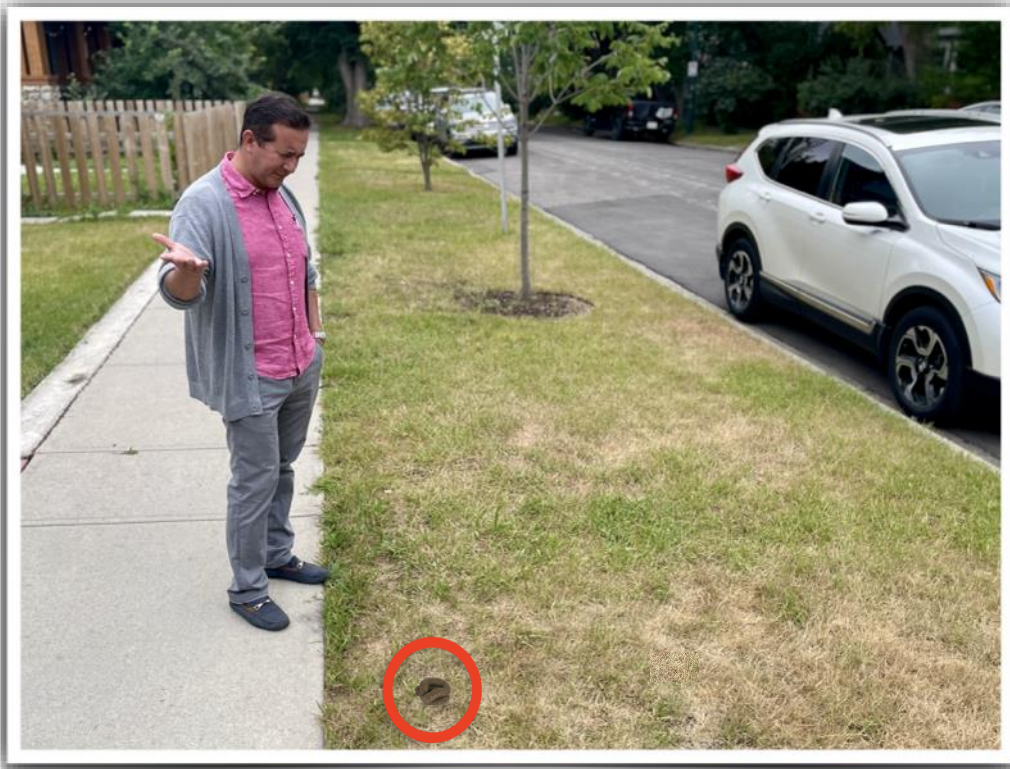
One dog pooped and Donna picked it up.

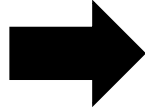
